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5. The information must be relevant and interesting to area of research.

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Conclusions: conclude the study linking back to the aim of the study.



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Should be about 10-25 pages long, contain up-to-date information, comprehensively cover relevant literature and preferably be written by scientists who have in-depth knowledge on the topic. All format requirements are same as those applicable to full papers. Review articles need not be divided into sections such as materials and Methods and Results and Discussion, but should definitely have an Abstract, Keywords and Introduction, Conclusions & References if necessary.

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Conclusions: Link the conclusions with the goals of the study but avoid unqualified statements and conclusions not adequately supported by the data. In particular, authors should avoid making statements on economic benefits and costs unless their manuscript includes the appropriate economic data and analysis. Avoid claiming priority and alluding to work that has not been completed. State new hypothesis when warranted, but clearly label them as such.

References: All references must be cited in the text as superscript & numbered in order of appearance, at the end of the article in numeric sequence. Do not include unpublished data or personal communications in the reference list.

Acknowledgments: Acknowledge persons who have made substantive contributions to the review. This part should be incorporated into the title page only.

Abbreviations: The full term for which an abbreviation stands should precede its first use in the text unless it is a standard unit of measurement. Trade names. Generic terms are to be used whenever possible, but trade names and manufacturer name, city, state, and country should be included parenthetically at first mention.



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Introduction: Should include definition, history, etiopathogenesis, and prevalence and distribution patterns. Explain why this report is special.



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Case Report: Chief complaint, History, Clinical features, Radiographic and other investigation findings, Diagnosis, treatment plan and prognosis.

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1. Should be a short and decisive observation.
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Announcements of Conferences, Meetings, Courses, Awards

Any other items likely to be of interest to the readers should be submitted with the name and address of the person from whom additional information can be obtained up to 100 words.

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figures should be brief, but complete and self-explanatory so that the reader can easily understand the results presented in the figure.
